THE NEED

Interim dining facility while existing was demolished and a new one was built.

THE SOLUTION

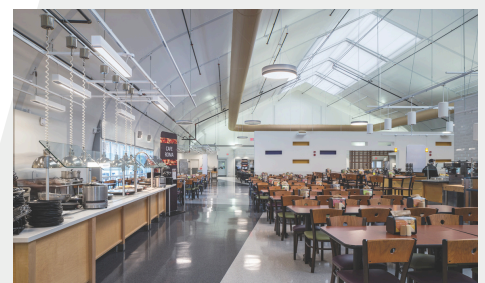
Two facilities: D-Hub, a 27,000 sq. ft. dining complex with seating for 1,000. Plus, a stand-alone Chick-fil-A.

PROJECT INFORMATION

The complex includes cooking modules, prep modules, dishwashing modules as well as cold and dry storage facilities. A concrete patio deck with outdoor seating surrounds the north exterior of the structure with walkup windows featuring a full menu of pizza, pasta and grill items. The second facility is a standalone, full menu, Chick-fil-A with seating for 100 and sits directly across the street from the original D-Hall.

QUICK FACTS

- Met specific standards set in order to maintain operational excellence and expand the student dining experience.
- Walk-up windows provide a “late night” option for the campus community as well as a grab-and-go breakfast each morning, elevating the services and dining experience over what was previously available.
- Appearance of a permanent facility and fits well with the other buildings on campus.



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
